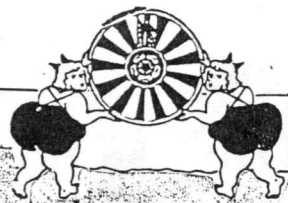

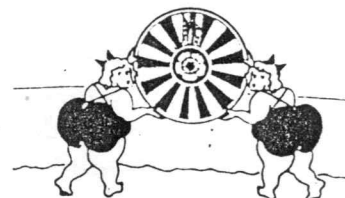

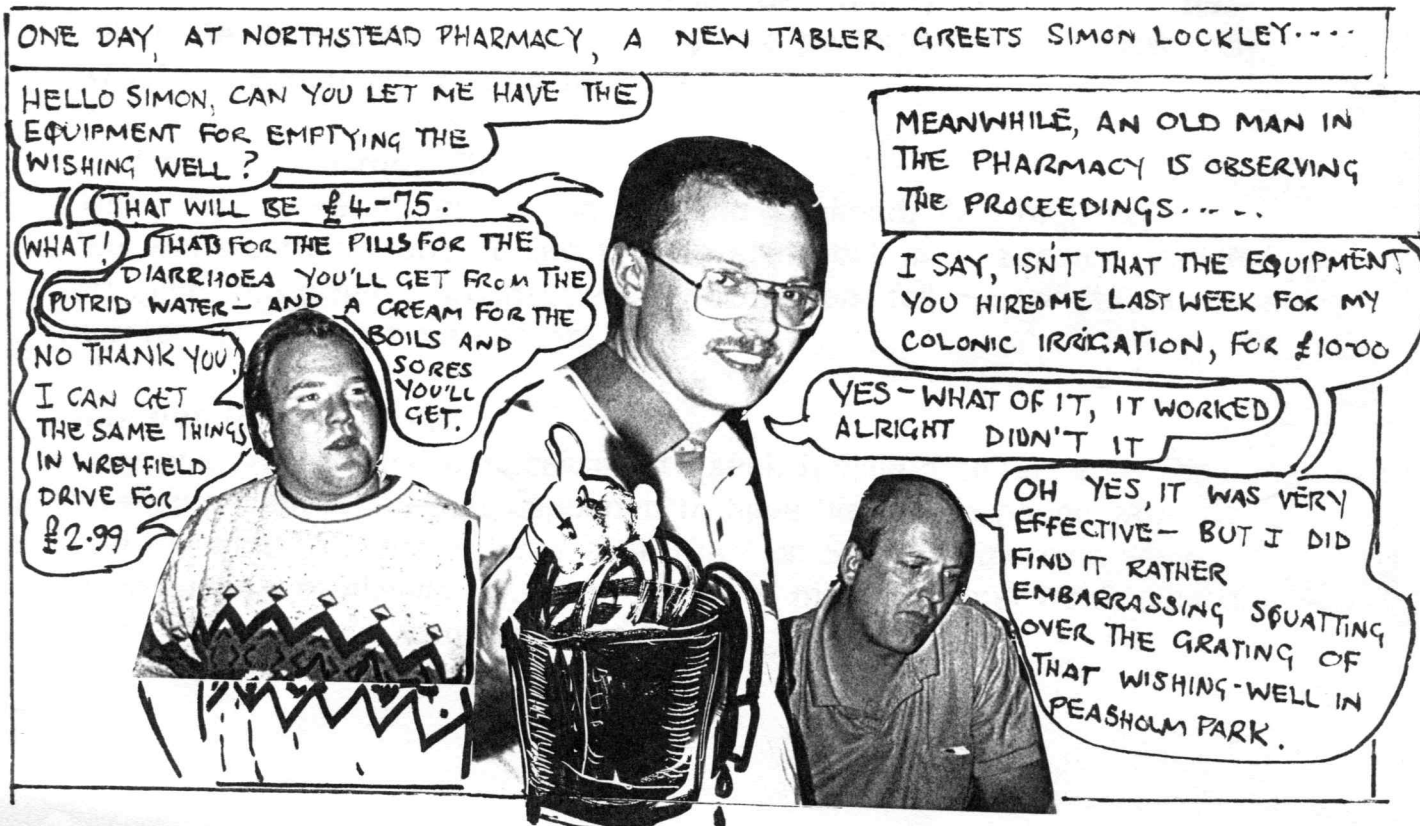

Even more lastly, apologies to the rabbit family who ended up with more shit from round table than even the chairman.

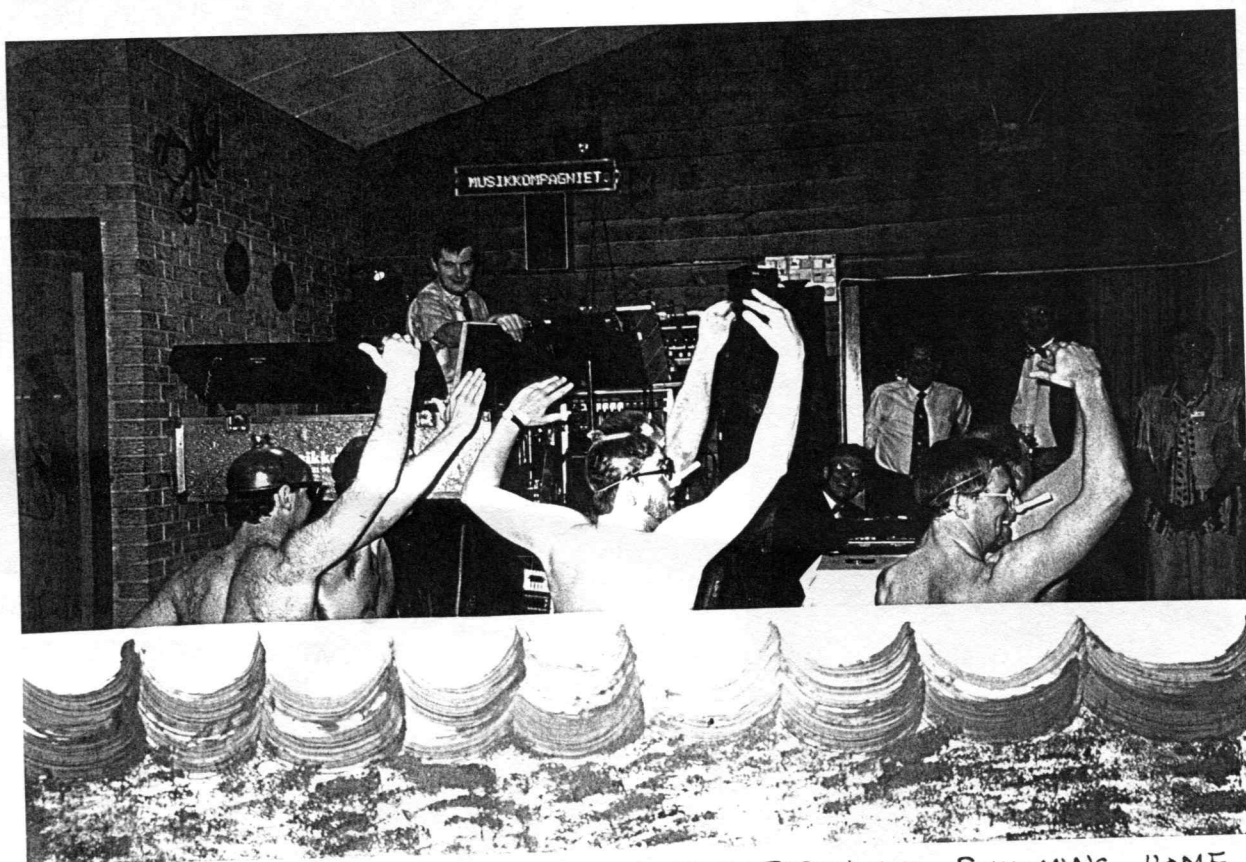

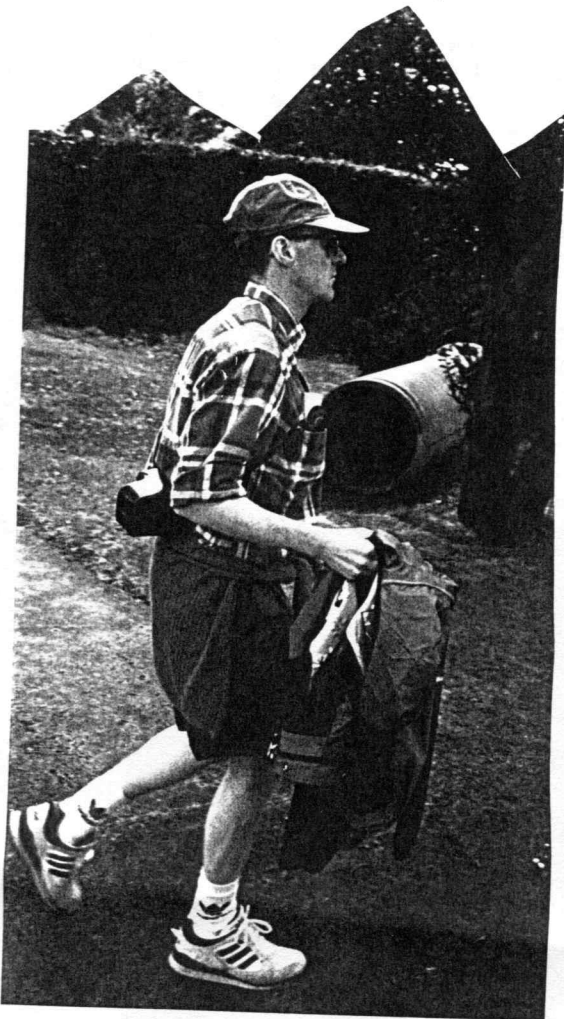

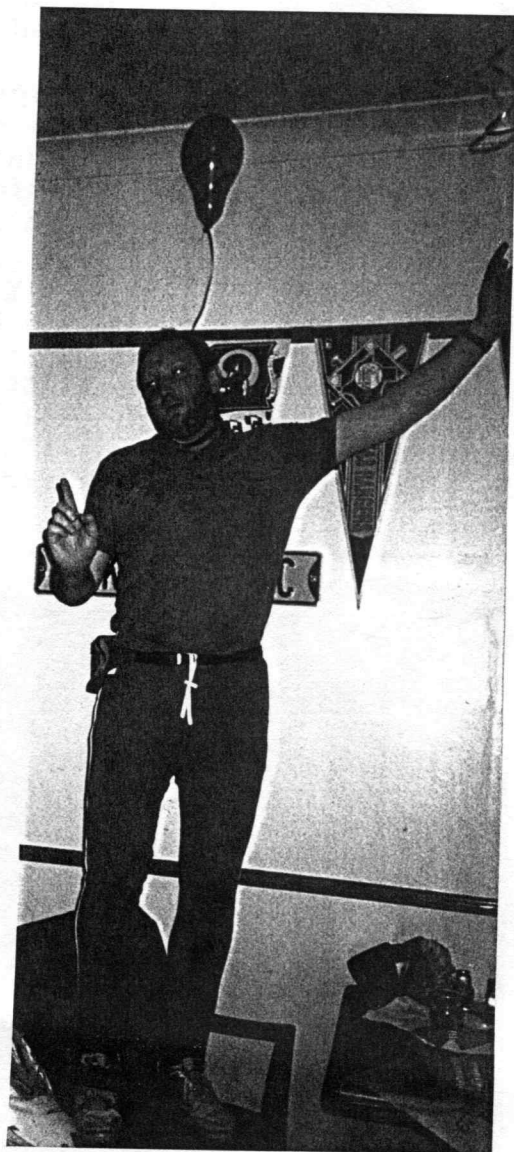

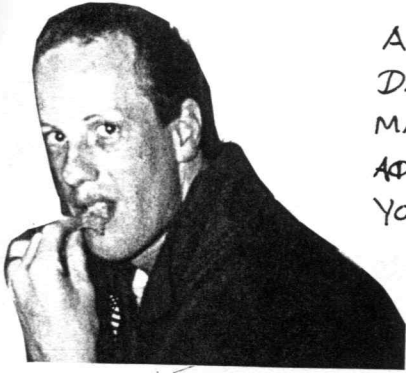

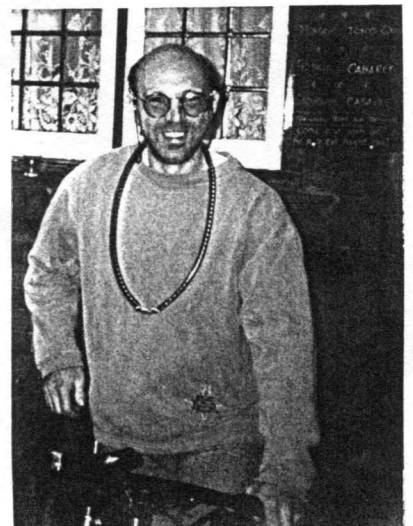
