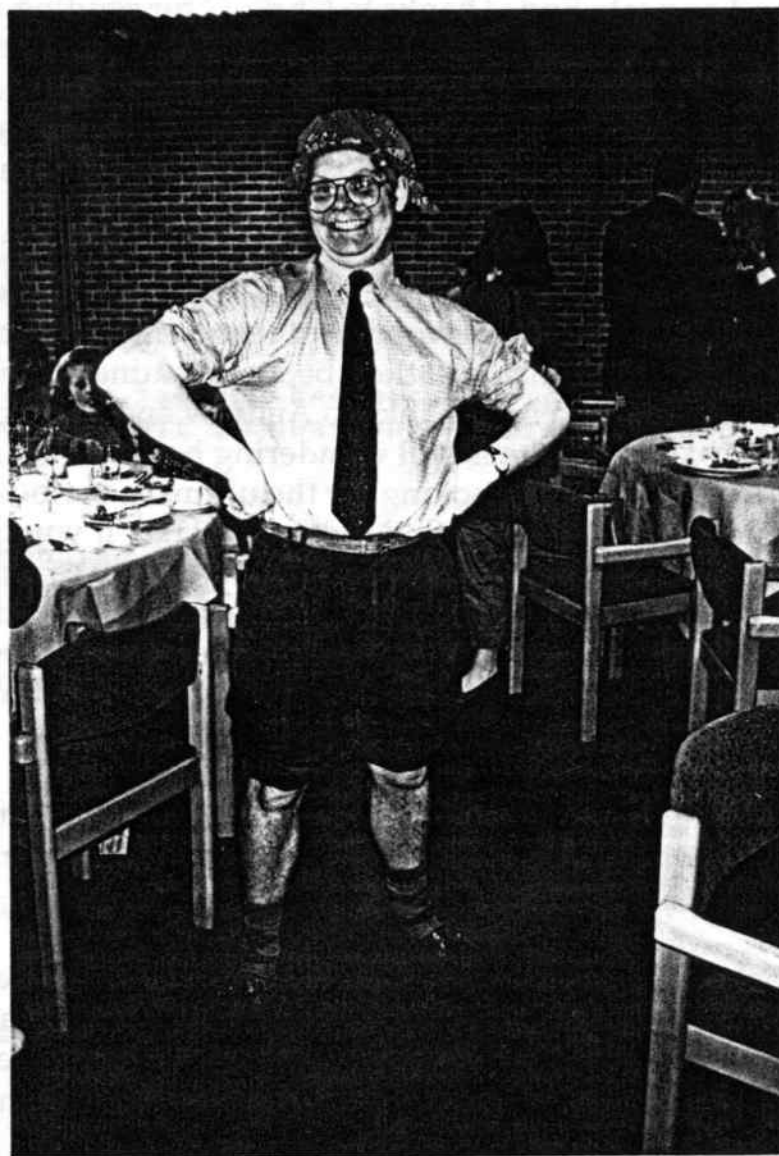

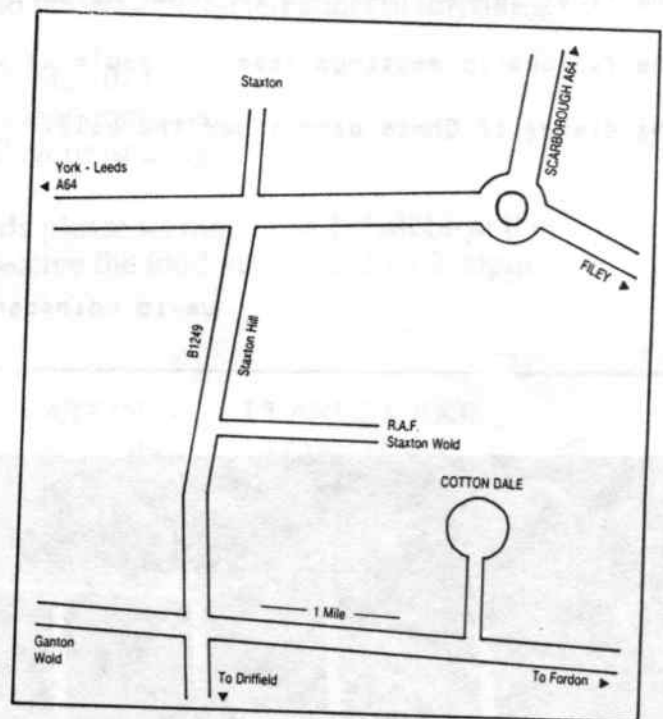
## JUNE MEETING

# Society 'fined' us £1,300 for paying off our mortgage



JOANNE and Andrew Rising can't afford carpets and a fire-place for their new home—because they have been forced to pay a penalty for switching building societies when they took out a new mortgage.

The couple borrowed £38,500 on a two bedroom terraced house four years ago. In January they agreed to sell it to a local builder for £44,000 in part-exchange for a new £62,000 home.

When their mortgage lenders—the Scarborough Building Society—turned down their application for a 90 per cent loan, the couple decided to switch to the Abbey National.

Tutor Joanne, 26, and plasterer Andrew, 30, had to work out their budget carefully for moving into a three-bed semi in Hunmanby, Yorks. They expected to pay one month's interest—about £300—as a penalty for switching.

But in 10 weeks Joanne and Andrew received four different mortgage redemption quotations and ended up paying £1,300 more than they'd borrowed to switch building societies.

When you settle up your mortgage, your previous society calculates what you owe them and sends you a mortgage redemption quotation.

They ask you to agree figures and pay up before you can get a new loan with another society.

But in Joanne's case, there was no sense to the figures.

**QUOTATION No 1:** On February 1 the Scarborough told the couple it would cost £39,984.23 to settle the mortgage—£1,500 more than their £38,500 loan.

**QUOTATION No 2:** They queried it and on February 24 were told it was £39,558.20—down £426.

**QUOTATION No 3:** On April 1 the society said it was £40,508.82—£2,000 more than their loan.

Joanne went to the society's office, demanding an explanation. She said: "I thought it was an April Fool's joke."

In a letter to her solicitor, Tony Gambles, society bosses explained: "We have included extra interest in accordance with the terms of the mortgage agreement and rules of the society."

The letter went on: "I strongly recommend your clients re-mortgaging with the society, not only to gain the benefits of our mortgage portfolio but (also) to save money."

## Threat

Joanne was furious and demanded a breakdown of charges from David Ascough, the society regional manager.

At first he said there was nothing he could do. But when Joanne threatened to contact The Sun he agreed to re-examine the quotation.

Later he phoned Jo-

anne and said: "I feel like Father Christmas today. I have reduced your redemption quotation by £318."

**QUOTATION No 4:** Arrived on April 16, for £39,787.82, showing the £318 "reduction" was an insurance refund.

The Risings had to pay nearly £1,300 more than they borrowed before they could move.

Joanne said: "Our mortgage was up to date and no one has given us an explanation."

"This wrecked our budget. We feel angry and very bitter."

Chief executive of the Scarborough, John Carrier, insisted his society had only charged one month's interest but promised to send the couple a full statement.

Joanne and Andrew will spend months without carpets because building societies don't give enough information to borrowers about how much it costs to settle up.
