



WHISK(E)Y CORNER

Lowlands Region



With the 'Beast from the Baltic' swirling around and bringing temperatures down across the country, I bring you greetings from inside the cosy warmth of the Association's Uisge Beatha Tasting Room where the log fire is burning away nicely..

I do hope some of you enjoyed the excellent fun and fellowship of the recent '41Connects' virtual Burns Night Supper in January that was hosted by our Association's own unofficial 'President of Scotland' in which we celebrated the Immortal Bard Robbie Burns' life, complete with passionate speeches, readings and bagpipes.



Believe it or not, there is more distillation in the **Lowlands Region of Scotland** than any other Scottish region, but its days as a significant single malt player were until recently being consigned to history. It was once a thriving hub of whisky production, until the need for grain to drive blended Scotch production, made making single malt an almost forgotten art. The Region is predominantly the home of the blend and of the large quantities of grain whisky which form its foundation.

An increasing number of outposts however have preserved the old ways of single malt distilling – as well as introducing some really intelligent new ways - and the grassy, easy-drinking style of malt that has many admirers is growing in its range of aromas and palates.

The four whiskies below are ones that my WACWAC whisky club and I have enjoyed and are delicious examples of the range and quality that this often over-looked Region can produce.

Glenkinchie 12yo - 46% (~ £40) aka 'The Edinburgh Malt'

There's a clue in the name, as the distillery lies in a glen of the Kinchie Burn (its water source) approx 15 miles from Edinburgh. The site has 3 warehouses onsite, hosting a variety of over 10,000 casks to mature its spirit – the local air must smell delicious! This particular whisky is aged for a minimum of 12 years in ex-bourbon casks.

The name 'Kinchie' is a corruption of 'De Quincy', the original owners of the land and its origins date back to around 1825 but 30 years later, the owners were bankrupted and the site converted to a sawmill. In the 1880s however, the distillery was rebuilt and whisky-making restarted.

The Glenkinchie label was relatively little known until 1989, when United Distillers started marketing it under their Classic Malts brand. It's also the home of Diageo's world-famous Johnnie Walker brand – and contributes to majority of their whiskies.

Nose: Very aromatic and flowery overall, like breathing in a country garden and beneath these, a clean, toasty note.

Taste: A sweet soft start, like crème anglaise, soon becoming flowery again. A really smooth delivery, especially after adding a drop of water.

Finish: Herbal and drying, a little like potpourri.



Ailsa Bay 1.2 Sweet Smoke - 48.9% (~£50)

Named after the Island of Ailsa Craig in the Firth of Clyde, this whisky uses water from the Penwapple reservoir and is the only peated whisky produced in the Lowlands (the peat comes from the Highlands).

The distillery is the largest in the Lowlands this is the only Scotch whisky to undergo a micro-maturation whereby the spirit is first filled to small ex-bourbon casks (Hudson Bay) for 9 months for an intense rapid maturation, before being transferred to virgin, first-fill and refill American oak casks for several years

Nose: Fresh wood smoke with notes of smouldering damp heather and an extinguished bonfire. Following the smoke is a wave of oaky sweetness and vanilla oak with candied orange peel.

Taste: Beautifully balanced peat and rich vanilla oak – an intriguing flavour meandering between smoke, fruit and creamy toffee.

Finish: A beautiful mixture of oaky sweetness and peaty dryness.





Kingsbarns Family Reserve 2020 – 59.2% (£60)

From a small family-owned distillery near St Andrews in the ‘Kingdom of Fyfe’ that’s only been open since 2014. Using water from their own underground well, it is owned by the Scottish Wemyss family who have had a longstanding passion for malt whisky and their connections with the industry date back to the turn of the 19th century when John Haig (founder of Haig’s) built his first distillery on Wemyss land.

This whisky is from carefully selected 1st fill ex-bourbon (90%) and 1st fill ‘STR’ casks (10%) - STR being the acronym in whisky maturation for 'Shaved, Toasted and Recharred' ex-Portuguese red wine casks.

Nose: A strong floral note of jasmine and honeysuckle, with honeyed mango, vanilla saffron custard, banana, wine gums and strawberry fondant. Amazing aroma!

Taste: A mouth-watering palate of sweet shortbread feel with exotic fruits such as mango and papaya. This morphs into elements of coconut which then changes to a more complex oak spice.

Finish: Intense yet fruity, oaky spice – really impressive considering how young this whisky is.

Bladnoch Samsara - 46.6% (~£67)

An exquisite whisky from the most Southerly distillery in Scotland and the one of the oldest (1817), that uses the adjacent River Bladnoch as its water source.

The distillery had seen many changes of owners over the years and was eventually bought by Arthur Bell’s & Sons for their blends. At one point in 1993 there was talk of the distillery being converted into holiday homes and production stopped in 2009 – everyone thought that was the end of the line for this, the most lowly of the lowland distilleries. In 2015 however, it was bought by Australian entrepreneur David Prior and underwent an extensive refurbishment for 2 years and resumed production in 2017 to celebrate its 200 year anniversary.

Samsara means ‘rebirth’ in Buddhism and was named to celebrate reopening of the distillery; it is a full-bodied and fragrant blend of malts matured in ex Bourbon and ex Californian red wine casks. The no age statement full-bodied whisky is said to be made up of whiskies that are a minimum of 8 years as well as older, rarer whiskies. First fill Californian red wine and bourbon casks have been used for maturation. A truly delicious dram!

Nose: It has an aroma of Vanilla cream, with floral notes of fresh cut apples

Taste: An incredible palate of thick vanilla fudge with flavours of sweet, floral grass

Finish: A rich, mouth coating finish leading to a refreshing citrus edge around the edge of the tongue.



A problem is being encountered where Club Officer details are being updated incorrectly via the Club Landing pages.

Some Clubs are updating their Officer's details via the "members" screen rather than the "Officers" screen.

The Correct screen for updating Club Officers is the screen below. The Officers are assigned for each post using the dropdown list of members associated with each post. I am using my club Shipley as an example with my name in every field, just for demonstration purposes.



If you have made changes via the "members" screen you may have inadvertently corrupted the links for you Club members. We have identified that a number of Clubs have updated their Officers using the incorrect method.

We are waiting for a list to be supplied by our software provider to identify these Clubs. This will be distributed to the appropriate National Councillor, who will be able to assist Clubs in correcting the problem.




